Registration

Resort & Lodging

Note: the Edelweiss Chalet has been completely renovated and has beautiful rooms, but it is nestled at the foot of the mountain and does not have its own parking lot. Hotel staff provides luggage assistance to those staying at the Edelweiss.

Boyne Mountain is a cashless resort. If you plan on utilizing resort services outside of what is provided through the conference, you will need a credit or debit card. The resort does have a reverse ATM where you can exchange cash for Visa debit cards that are accepted anywhere.

Sky Package

Ride the scenic chair lift and take a walk on the wild side across the new, pedestrian-only, 1200 foot long, 118 foot high suspension SkyBridge that stretches between McLouth and Disciples Ridge peaks and overlooks Boyne Valley. Activities also include disc golf and the evening welcome reception.

Water Package

Slip, slide, swim and splash at the Avalanche Bay Indoor Water Park that features a surf simulator, lazy river float, hot tubs, and a wide variety of slides, pools, and fun. You can also ride the scenic chair lift, play disc golf, and attend the evening welcome reception.
